*Hello to all Rover Enthusiasts! We are issuing a Call for Registrations and a reminder to see Bulletin 2 for all registration and regalia information.*

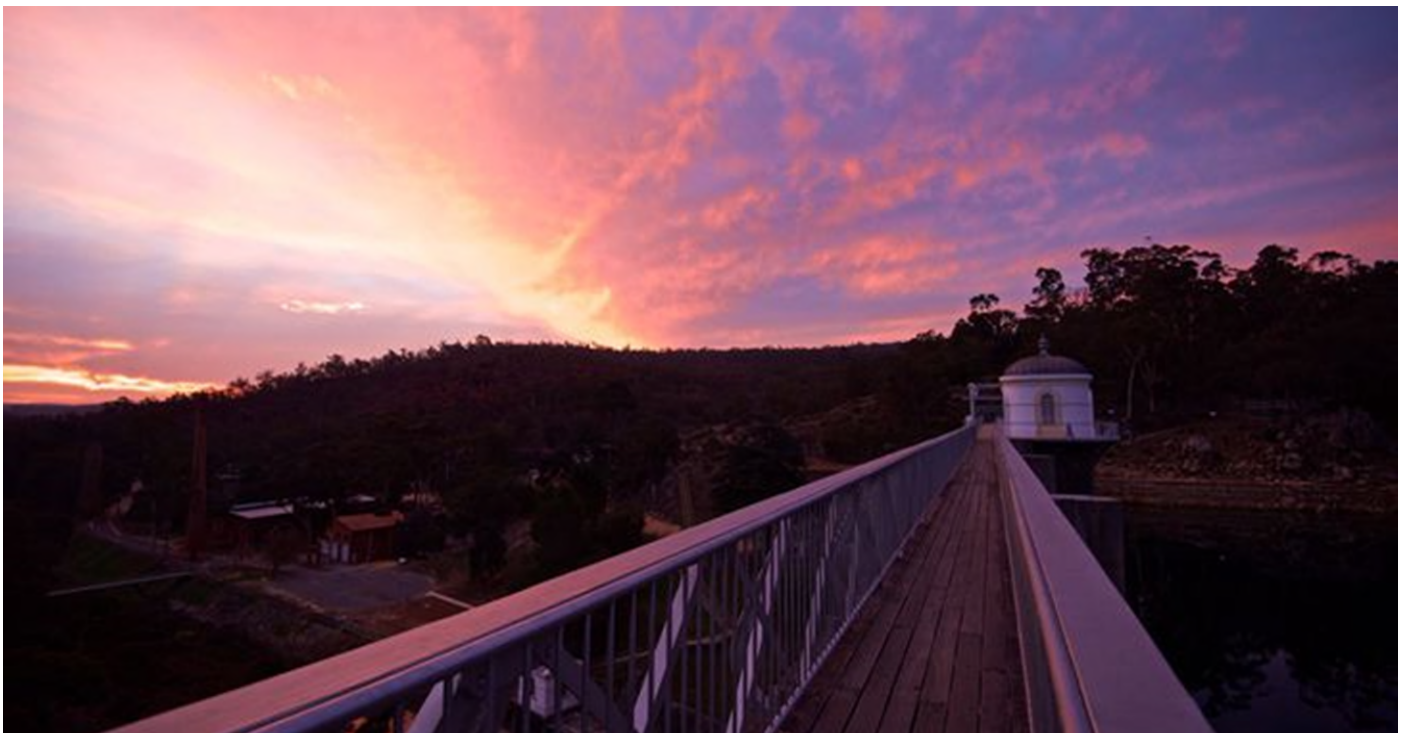
*Please note all regalia must be pre-ordered. The early payment date is to account for the manufacturing lead time.*

**Post Rove Planning!:**

**Following the Farewell Breakfast Monday morning at the Pagoda there will be an optional post Rove convoy run out to the Mundaring Weir in the afternoon.**



The National Trust of WA is arranging to open the museum at [No. 1 Pump Station](#) and give all interested a tour for \$7/person. Volunteers will be on hand to explain the engineering feat of the [Golden Pipeline](#) that carries water in the longest freshwater pipeline in the world all the way to Kalgoorlie, over 566 km.



The drive up to Mundaring takes in several reserves along the back roads up the Darling Scarp. After the tour we will do sightseeing from the weir and take the forested, winding Mundaring Weir Road on the way back through the very heart of the [Beelu National Park](#).

**The following are some suggestions by the committee of some of their favourite places to go Perth-side:**

[Araluen Botanical Park](#) – tulip festival, historical gardens, book ahead as very popular in September.

[Wireless Hill Park](#) – museum of radio communications, elevated parkland with wildflowers.

[Caversham Wildlife Park](#) – native fauna next door to Whiteman Park

[Rottnest Island](#) – home of the quokka, white sand beaches, car free cycling

**Destinations involving a day drive through lovely countryside:**

[The Swan Valley](#) (map included in rally bag) – wineries, artisanal food and drink industries, pleasant country roads, scenic river views.

[Chittering Valley](#) (map included in rally bag) – scenic region of small country roads, orchards, vineyards, wildflowers and natural bushland. [Tourist Drive 359](#)

[York - motor museum \(9-4 every day\)](#) \$12, \$10 concession, rolling fields of canola, oldest inland town in WA. Lovely longer day drive out the Great Eastern Highway, turn right at the Great Southern Highway 50 km from Perth and follow the road to York.
