History

The Club was established in 1983, when around sixty Rover enthusiasts responded to a newspaper advertisement and met in Mt Lawley. Doug Lyons and Trevor Ward, the two men understood to have conceived the idea of forming a club, became the inaugural President and Secretary. An earlier club, the Rover Classic Sports Register, catered for models up to the P3 only and had become defunct by the mid 1970s. Some of its former members joined the new club at the inaugural meeting, thereby providing a firm foundation of experience on which to build.



Very early on the club adopted a constitution and became incorporated to give impetus to its main aim of assisting Rover owners and enthusiasts to preserve the cars, enjoy their use and keep the famous marque alive in Western Australia. Membership has grown steadily over the years and the Club enjoys a sound financial position thanks to excellent administrative and financial management throughout its history.

In 2001, a branch of the Club was formed in the south-west of WA to cater for the significant number of keen Rover and Land Rover enthusiasts in the area. This branch closed in 2026 after 25 yrs of excellent service to the Rover marque.

Meetings and Events

The General Meetings for the Western Australian Rover Owners Club (Inc.) are held at the Veteran and West Australian Car Clubs' Centre, 265 Hale Road, Wattle Grove on the 3rd Wednesday of each month, doors open at 7.00 pm for tea and biscuits.

If you have a particularly rare or interesting car, or any car under restoration, you are welcome to either drive or trailer it to our general meetings and place it in the club room for all to inspect after the meeting, whilst listening to you regale the throng with the ups and downs you've encountered along the way.

Events are held every month usually on the Sunday following the General Meeting. Past events include visits to the Aviation Heritage Museum in Bull Creek, the Annual Gingin British Car Day, tours of York and a local winery, combined scenic drives with the Riley Club, picnics on the foreshore, the river and Lake Monger, fun rally/ economy drive, and so on.

Membership

Membership is open to owners and drivers of any model of Rover or Land Rover vehicle, and those who are interested in Rover cars and their preservation. Members' vehicles range from a 1934 Rover 14hp through to the current Land Rover Discovery III. Prospective members are invited to attend one of our general meetings.
